- **The Rise of Victimhood Culture: Microaggressions, Safe Spaces, and the New Culture Wars**, by sociologists Bradley Campbell and Jason Manning, 2018. Campbell is Associate Professor of Sociology at California State University, Manning is Associate Professor of Sociology at West Virginia University. I highly recommend this book.
- **The 1867 Project: Why Canada Should Be Cherished—Not Cancelled**, edited by Mark Milke. Twenty distinct voices making a case for Canada, 2023. Mark Milke Ph. D., is president of the Aristotle Foundation for Public Policy. This book is a collection of essays written by a diverse group of people on the topic of Wokism in Canada. I highly recommend this book for its Canadian content.
- **Woke Racism, How a New Religion has Betrayed Black America**, 2022. John McWhorter. McWhorter teaches linguistics, American Studies and Music at Columbia University. This is a helpful book to understand how Black Americans, who do not accept Critical Race Theory, argue for a better way of dealing with real racism.
